

# LEONARD A. LAUDER FELLOWSHIPS IN MODERN ART

Founded in April 2013, the Leonard A. Lauder Research Center for Modern Art is a leading center for scholarship on modern art and makes critical contributions to the field through its fellowships for emerging as well as senior scholars and its robust program of lectures, workshops, exhibitions, publications, and research projects. While maintaining a special focus on the study of Cubism and its enduring impact, the Research Center encourages new directions in the broader field of modern art, architecture, design, and visual culture around the world.

Each year, The Metropolitan Museum of Art offers two fellowships in the Research Center. One two-year position is intended for a predoctoral candidate who is embarking on a dissertation; the other fellowship is reserved for a qualified postdoctoral scholar at any career stage and may be one or two years in duration. Fellowships in the Research Center offer an exceptional opportunity for scholars of modernism to conduct focused research on an independent project. Recent fellowships have supported such topics as Art Brut, Czech Modernism, Dada, Brazilian modern art, interwar European Abstraction, Russian Constructivism, and Surrealism, in addition to the agents, dealers, and reception of Cubism.

All Fellows must be in residence at The Metropolitan Museum of Art for the duration of the fellowship period. Predoctoral fellowships are for 24 months and must take place between September 1, 2022 and August 31, 2024. Postdoctoral fellowships may be 12 or 24 months in duration and must take place between September 1, 2022 and (depending on the length of the fellowship) August 31, 2023 or August 31, 2024. The stipend amount for one year is \$45,000 for predoctoral fellows and \$55,000 for postdoctoral fellows. Leonard A. Lauder Fellows will be eligible to receive travel stipends.
